During the reception at Chalk Hill Winery, Claire and Dickie gathered up some of the 'Founding Advocates' to kick off the new group.

The following day, Claire, Dickie, Leslie and I were invited by the Government of South Australia to join a CEO Innovation Roundtable session at Lot Fourteen, Adelaide's innovation hub. I was invited to do an introductory keynote to discuss Global Tech Advocates and reflect on Australia's tech sector in the global tech ecosystem. We were joined by a variety of leaders and CEOs representing startups, scaleups, Adelaide University, BAE Systems, Stone & Chalk, Defence Training Centre, Santos, Amazon Web Services, 42 and others.

It was an excellent opportunity to hear about the South Australia tech sector opportunities and challenges. Like many other tech hubs, scaling capital is a challenge and funding for female founders has been limiting. I was also struck by the lack of deeper engagement between larger corporates and universities in the region, especially in relation to tech transfer/spinout collaboration demonstrated by American and British universities.





There is a strong desire to address these challenges, and an understanding that collaboration across the ecosystem is critical. Diane Dixon, State Project Lead from the Government of South Australia who co-hosted the session, has taken this on board as part of her remit. Claire and Dickie explained how Tech Australia Advocates can play a key role here across the various states across Australia, to help with the collaboration across the national ecosystem.

Claire, Dickie, Leslie and I then spent some time discussing next steps for the new 'TAA' in terms of building the community, linking to the new GTA Launch Pad initiative and planning for future events.
